THE HONOR OF GOD

Honor & The Fear Of The Lord

I. Malachi 1:6-A son honors his father and a servant honors his master If I be a father where is my honor, if I be a master where is my fear; He starts off by saying a servant honors his master, but then he says if I be a master where is my fear; We see a connection between the honor of God and the fear of the Lord

- A. Walking in the honor of God and the fear of the Lord is something that believers are supposed to do-Hebrews 12:28
 - 1. If God is your father then you should honor him and if he's your master you should reverence him
- B. When we honor God He and His things are weighty to us, they are important to us, they're big to us and we treat them in such a way that reflects that; When we dishonor God He and His stuff is light, unimportant, trivial and we treat them as light
 - <u>Honor</u>-To be heavy, To be weighty (Weighty-Important, big, serious, momentous, important, significant, meaningful)
 - The opposite of weighty is <u>light</u>-having little weight, not important, <u>slight</u>-of no great importance, negligent, not done with effort, <u>trifling</u>-being of small value or importance, trivial, acting and talking with levity, without seriousness
 - 3. Isaiah 24:20-The earth shall reel to & fro like a drunkard, and shall be removed like a cottage; & the transgression thereof shall be <u>heavy</u> upon it; and it shall fall, and not rise again.
 - 4. Genesis 18:20-And the LORD said, Because the cry of Sodom and Gomorrah is great, and because their sin is very <u>grievous;</u>
 - Job 6:2-3-Oh that my grief were throughly <u>weighed</u>, and my calamity laid in the <u>balances</u> together! <u>3</u>
 For now it would be <u>heavier</u> than the sand of the sea
 - 6. Genesis 12:10-And there was a famine in the land: and Abram went down into Egypt to sojourn there; for the famine was <u>grievous</u> in the land.
 - 7. Exodus 5:9-7 Ye shall no more give the people straw to make brick, as heretofore: let them go and gather straw for themselves. <u>8</u> And the tale of the bricks, which they did make heretofore, ye shall lay upon them; ye shall not diminish ought thereof: for they be idle; therefore they cry, saying, Let us go and sacrifice to our God.<u>9</u> Let there more work be <u>laid</u> upon the men, that they may labour therein; and let them not <u>regard</u> vain words. (He wants this work to be the heaviest thing in their life, not sacrificing to their God)
 - 8. Ezekiel 27:24-25-These were thy merchants in all sorts of things, in blue clothes, and broidered work, and in chests of rich apparel, bound with cords, and made of cedar, among thy merchandise. The

ships of Tarshish did sing of thee in thy market: and thou wast replenished, and made very <u>glorious</u> in the midst of the seas. (As they loaded it down, it was heavy, more valuable, more significant)

- C. Without the honor of God being in place reverence for God will never be fully demonstrated
 - 1. When something is really weighty to you it inspires awe which then leads to respect and reverence
 - a. When something is weighty to you, you will treat it with reverence and respect
 - 2. In these verses God started with honor because that's why there was no fear/reverence
 - a. God and his things were light to them and that's why there was no fear/reverence/respect
 - 3. The weightier God and his stuff becomes to you the more respect you will show them

a. You will treat disrespectfully what you regard lightly

- b. This attitude and mindset that it's not big deal is giving birth to disrespect
- D. When honor is not present the fear of the Lord will be absent
 - They <u>despise</u> God's name-Regard with contempt; To slight; To neglect as unworthy of regard, esteem, respect; Worthless
 - They said the table of the Lord was <u>contemptible</u>-Unworthy of regard, esteem, respect; To slight; Worthless
 - 3. God's stuff wasn't as weighty to them as it should have been, it's light to them and that led to them disrespecting the Lord
 - a. It was so light to them that it wasn't even worth the good bread and the good sacrifice
- E. If God's stuff will become more weighty to us our fear/reverence/respect for Him will be demonstrated at a higher level and therefore developing in the honor of God will yield the fear of the Lord; If God's stuff is as big of a deal as it should be the respect will be there
 - 1. Magnifying the Lord has to do with seeing God bigger and making a big deal out of Him and His things and that is honor
 - a. Acts 10:46-Magnify-Esteem highly, Deem great
 - b. Psalm 34:3-Magnify-Become great or important, Praise
 - 2. Romans 11:13-I **magnify my office** (honor, hold in honor, cause the worth of a thing to be acknowledged)
 - a. The respect for your office won't be there if you're honor for the office is absent
 - 3. Daniel 11:36-38-He magnified himself and in His eye is the biggest thing, heaviest thing in his life
 - a. He has magnified himself in his own mind until what he wants is the most important thing in his life
 - b. He doesn't regard (esteem) God and regards himself above God
 - c. <u>Magnify</u>-Make great or important
 - d. Proverbs 12:9-Honoring yourself, Make yourself heavy

- F. 12-You have <u>profaned</u> my name (made it common, dishonor); It should have been weighty to you, but it became just another thing
 - They brought these offerings everyday and at some point what was once heavy/weighty to them became light, it became common to them and when it became light the respect dissipated
 - 2. In a routine it is easy to lose honor because what we do over and over again becomes common and it's easy then to let your standards of how you treat this thing to slip
 - 3. Some are put God on the scale and there's no difference between Him and everything else that goes on in their life
 - a. That means the scales balance; They put God and their job on the scale and it balances, God and the family and it balances, Church and baseball practice and it balances
 - And if that's your attitude then God is going to get the same level of reverence that everything else gets and He's going to be asking you where's my honor, where's my fear (What have you given it to instead of me because I don't have it)
 - 4. 12-This disrespect is most greatly demonstrated in how we treat God and His stuff, not in what we say
 - They didn't actually say this with their words, but they are "saying" this by how they are treating God and His things
 - b. Matthew 15:8-This is an area where there is the greatest distance between what we say and what actually is
 - 5. Because this wasn't weighty to them irreverence/disrespect manifested in how they treated God and His stuff; Going through the motions is very disrespectful and they are doing so b/c to them this is no big deal (They're still bringing the sacrifice and the bread)
 - a. 11-The Lord said I'm going to find somebody who my stuff is weighty to (Great-In importance)
 - Acts 13:46-It's a principle in the scripture that God's going to find somebody who honors him, who his stuff is weighty to
- G. What that tells me is that without honor in place your prayer life will be unfruitful
 - 1. 9-TAY-You recite, "God be gracious to us!" But when you bring that kind of gift why should he show you any favor at all
 - 2. This is an epidemic in the body of Christ today; People that have no time for God, people to whom his stuff is not weighty and means little to praying and asking God to be gracious to them and give them a happy life
 - 3. If the Kingdom of God is not first in your life, then you are not positioned to reap the benefits of it for your life
- II. Weighty vs. Light

- A. 2 Samuel 6:20-22-How <u>glorious</u> was the king of Israel today; She thinks he's devaluing himself in the eyes of the people, that the people will think little of him if they see this; David said they won't think lightly of me for seeing his they will think more of me when they see this
 - 1. <u>Vile</u>-To slight, trifling, lightly esteemed, make light, treat with contempt, bring dishonor; <u>Base</u>-Low
- B. Isaiah 43:4-When something is very valuable to you, precious to you it's weighty, it's important to you
 - 1. <u>Precious</u>-Esteem, valuable, highly valued; <u>Honorable</u>-Weighty, Heavy
- C. Leviticus 10:1-3-When the fire of the Lord is devouring people for offering strange fire before the Lord, which the Lord commanded them not to, it's going to cause the Lord to be more weighty among the people; this would cause God and His stuff to be weighty
- D. Isaiah 43:5-6-The prophet said I will be glorious (heavy) in the eyes of the Lord The Lord esteems me highly
 - 1. God said to him it's no light (little, insignificant, treat with contempt and dishonor, to make light of) thing to be my servant
- E. Isaiah 23:8-9-The Lord is going to make light of the honorable of the earth (those who are weighty in the world's eyes)
 - God's going to cause the "weighty" of the earth to be <u>Contempt</u>-Little, insignificant, make light of, lightly esteemed)
- F. Haggai 1:8-Their stuff was weightier than God's and God said if you put me first and build my house I will be heavy (glorified)
- G. Nahum 3:10-They cast lots for her <u>honorable</u> (heavy, weighty) men and all her <u>great</u> (in importance) men were bound in chains
- H. Isaiah 3:5-The <u>base</u> (lightly esteemed) against the <u>honorable</u> (weighty, heavy)
- Lamentations 1:8-All that honored (weighty) her, despise (Light, insignificant) her, because they have seen her nakedness: yea she sighs and turns backwards; She used to be a big deal, weighty, buw not she is insignificant
- J. Psalm15:4-In whose eyes a vile person is <u>contemned</u> (Despise, worthless, regard with contempt) but he honors them that fear the Lord
- K. Jeremiah 30:19-I will **glorify** (Heavy, Weighty) them and they shall not be **small** (Insignificant)

III. 1 Samuel 2:12-30-In your life, if anything is weightier than the Lord and His things irreverence is going to manifest

- A. God and his stuff was light to them, He and His things were no more weighty than anything else and therefore we know that irreverence and disrespect is going to show up
 - Knew-Discriminate (Observe the difference between), Distinguish (To know or ascertain difference)
 Consider (To have regard to, to respect) acknowledge (To receive with respect)

- a. They didn't observe the difference between God and everybody else; to them God was common
- b. They didn't ascertain that God has His things were weightier than everything else; to them God and His stuff was no more weighty than anything else
- They didn't <u>regard</u> Him-To attend to with respect and estimation, to value; To esteem; to hold in respect and affection
- 3. **<u>Belial</u>**-Base, worthless, good for nothing (Belial is light)
- B. Because God was light to them irreverence manifested; They abhorred the offering of the Lord
 [Abhorred-To contemn (To slight; To neglect as unworthy of regard), Despise, To Spurn, Neglect (To slight, to not treat with attention or respect)]
 - 1. They treated it lightly, but it was not a light thing to the Lord
 - 2. 29-They are kicking at the offering of the Lord, the trample upon it and treat it with contempt
 - 3. Judges 20:34-Here you have something that is very heavy, weighty but they didn't know it was weighty
- C. Honor your sons above me-Nothing in your life should be weightier, heavier than God and His things
 - 1. He put his sons and God on the scale and His sons were heavier than the Lord
 - 2. Whoever, whatever is heavier than the Lord will be respected above the Lord
 - a. Malachi 1-Where's my honor? Where's my fear? That's literally God saying who's heavier to you than me
 - b. If you misplace where your honor you'll misplace your respect
 - 3. To Eli's sons they were weightier than the Lord; they put themselves on the scale with the Lord & they went down and the Lord went up
 - a. So then when it came to the best part of the offering in their eyes they were worthy of it and God was not
- D. To live a life of reverence we have to locate the things in our life that are weightier than Him and lose some weight on those things and gain some weight on God and His things
 - 1. When you put God on the scale He should never go up, nothing is bigger than Him, nothing is more important than him and that type of honor is going to yield this life of reverence
- E. 30-Isaiah 58:13-14-If God's stuff is weighty to you and you honor him and treat Him with respect he will honor you
 - 1. The way you treat something that is important to the Lord reveals your respect for the Lord
 - a. The Sabbath is **honorable**-heavy, weighty
 - b. <u>**Holy**</u>-It is sacred, special, set apart
 - 2. It's too weighty to just be treating it like it's another day and doing your own stuff
