Humble Yourself

- I. No peace or joy in judging, despising, harshness-Rm14:1-Him that is weak in the faith receive ye but not to doubtful disputations (contentious arguments). For one believeth that he may eat all things: another who is weak eats herbs. Let not him that eats despise him that eats not and let not him which eats not judge him that eats... Who art thou that judges another man's servant? Why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother... At the servant of the
- despising, being harsh A. What you yield to you give place to and get full of Yield to judging, despising, harshness and you'll get full of the opposite of joy and peace
- II. Pride is a peace robber, a joy thief-The prouder you are the more you'll judge and despise, the harsher and more contentious you'll be and the less peace and joy you'll experience-Pr29:23-Man's pride shall bring him low (depress)
 - A. Pride is at the root of this judging, despising, harshness, contention
- These debates came by nride -
- Pride is given to strife (Agitation produced by opposition) -Pr13:10-Only by pride cometh contention [strife]-MS-Arrogant know-it-alls stir up discord; DRB-Among the proud there are always contentions-WEB-Pride only breeds quarrels
- 2. Pride despises (Little of others, much of self) -Pr21:24-Proud and haughty scorner [despiser] is his name who deals in proud wrath [crossing over from peace]
- 3. Pride deals in wrath (Anger, exasperation, indignation)-Pr21:24
- 4. <u>Pride judges</u>-It thinks it's somebody, it's higher-*Js4:12*-There is one lawgiver who is able to save and to destroy: who art thou that judges another?
- B. When you're humble you're gentle and kind-Pr11:2-With the lowly is wisdom-Js3:17-The wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable [peacemaking, free from feuds, unagitated], gentle and easy to be intreated, full of mercy [tender, kind] and good fruits, without partiality [judging] and without hypocrisy
- The more humble you are the less you judge/despise/wrath/strife and the more peace and joy you have-Pr12:20-NET-Those who promote peace have joy-Ps37:11-Meek [humble, gentle] shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace-Is29:19-Meek shall increase their joy in the LORD-Ps138:6-Hath respect unto the lowly but the proud he knows afar off-Ps34:18-GW-The Lord is near to those whose hearts are humble-Ps16:11-In thy presence is fullness of joy-Ph4:9-God of peace shall be with you
 - He was gentle, humble, didn't judge, Prince of Peace, anointed with oil of gladness-Mt11:28-Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden [burden with spiritual anxiety, load up] and I will give you rest [peace, inner rest]. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn of me for I am meek [gentle] and lowly [humble] in heart and ye shall find rest [inner tranquility] unto your souls-Jn12:47-If any man hear my words and believe not I judge him not-Is9:6-Hb1:9

To walk in peace and joy we must stop this judging, despising, harshness and to cut that off at the root we must humble ourselves and come out of pride1Pt5:6, Js4:10-Humble yourselves-Pr6:3-Go humble thyself-2Ch7:14-If my people...shall humble themselves-Ex10:3-How long wilt thou refuse to humble thyself
 - A. <u>Pride-1.High</u>, above-To lift oneself above others coupled with a despising of others-2.Arrogant-Unreasonably high claim of merits, estimation, importance-3.Raise in smoke, wrap in mist, becloud, stupefy-Dim grasp of reality-4.Pretending to be what one is not-To

judge, despise, be harsh you have to pretend like you have no faults Ob1:3-The pride of thine heart hath deceived thee, thou that dwellest in the clefts of the rock, whose habitation is high; that saith in his heart, Who shall bring me down to the ground? ⁴Though thou exalt thyself as the eagle, and though thou set thy nest among the stars, thence will I bring thee down, saith the Lord; Mt7:1-Judge not, that ye be not judged...³And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? ⁵Thou hypocrite (pretender)

- B. <u>Humility</u>-1.Low, not rising far from ground 2.Correct estimate of ourselves 3.Humus (Latin)-Ground, earth, soil-Rather than living in the clouds in some fantasy world you come down to earth or reality-2Co12:6-For though I would desire to glory (boast), I shall not be a fool; for I will say the truth: but (moreover) now I forbear, lest any man should think of me above that which he seeth me to be, or that he heareth of me.
- C. <u>You humble yourself by being honest</u>-We're not debasing ourselves we are just being honest, acknowledging the truth and reality
 - 1. IN-YOU truths-1.You are nothing-Ga6:3-If a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself-2.You know nothing-1Cor8:2-If any man think that he knows anything, he knows nothing yet as he ought to know-3.You can do nothing-Jn15:5-Without me ye can do nothing-4.You have nothing-1Cor4:7-What hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it?
 - 2. You are not different-1Cor4:7-For who maketh thee to differ from another?
 - 3. You are not better than anyone-Rm12:16-Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits-CJ-Don't think yourselves better than others; Rm3:9-What then? are we better than they? No, in no wise-Ph2:9-In lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves-Rm12:3-To every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think
 - 4. You have made mistakes-Rm3:23-For all have sinned
 - 5. You don't have it all together-Ec7:20-CJ-For there isn't a righteous person on earth who does only good and never sins

Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid;

Believers are to be glad-Ps32:11-Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, ye righteous: and shout for joy, all ye that are upright in heart-Ps35:27-Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause-Ps40:16-Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee-Ps64:10-The righteous shall be glad in the LORD-Ps68:3-Let the righteous be glad; let them rejoice before God: yea, let them exceedingly rejoice-Ps70:4-Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee-Ps149:5-Let the saints be joyful in glory: let them sing aloud upon their beds.

 - C. There's supposed to be a joy in faith-Ph1:25-Having this confidence, I know that I shall abide and continue with you all for your furtherance and joy of faith; CJ-I know I will stay on with you in order to help you progress in the faith and have joy in it; CSB-For your progress and joy in the faith
 - D. Finish our course with joy-Ac20:24-None of these things move me neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy, and the ministry, which I have received of the Lord Jesus, to testify the gospel of the grace of God

- E. There is a peace not understanble-Ph4:7-KJ-CEV-No one can completely understand-GNB-Far behond human understanding-ISV-Beyond anything we can imagine-WEY-Transcends our powers of thought-EX-So great we cannot understand it
- F. The opposite of this is heaviness-It is oppression of the soul-Js4:9-Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness [sadness, a downcast look of expressive sorrow, gloom, grief, weight, depression of spirit, oppression]
- G. How peaceable you are affects your peace and joy-Js3:14-But if ye have bitter [sharp, harsh, cruel] envying [heat, indignation, wrath] and strife [contention, quarrel, irritate] IN YOUR HEARTS, glory not, and lie not against the truth. ¹⁵This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly [worldly], sensual [natural], devilish. ¹⁶For where envying and strife is, there is confusion [instability, commotion, agitation, disturbance] and every evil work. ¹⁷But the wisdom that is from above is first pure [clean, modest-not arrogant], then peaceable [ST-Pacific-Peace-making, calm, tranquil, W18-Free from feuds, quiet, undisturbed, unagitated], gentle [moderation], and easy to be intreated, full of mercy [compassion, tender, kind] and good fruits, without partiality [judging], and without hypocrisy.
- H. Proverbs 30:12:13-There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes and yet is not washed from their filthiness; There is a generation, O how lofty are their eyes and their eyelids are lifted up
- I. Is16:6-We have heard of the pride of Moab; he is very proud: even of his haughtiness, and his pride, and his wrath: but his lies shall not be so.
- J. Jer48:29-We have heard the pride of Moab, (he is exceeding proud) his loftiness, and his arrogancy, and his pride, and the haughtiness of his heart.³⁰I know his wrath, saith the Lord; but it shall not be so; his lies shall not so effect it.
- K. Ps31:18-Let the lying lips be put to silence; which speak grievous things proudly and contemptuously against the righteous

Righteous indignation will push you towards the spirit, it'll directs your ire toward the devil; The wrath of man pushes towards sin and the flesh and pushes your ire toward man

Pr21:23-Whoso keepeth his mouth and his tongue keepeth his soul from troubles.

Your gentleness is connected to your joy and peace-Ph4:4-Rejoice [calmly happy, glad] in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your moderation [mild, calm, not rough/harsh/agitated, kind, merciful] be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand. ⁶Be careful [troubled with cares] for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. ⁷And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds

AC-Humility [which is the proper attribute] of true wisdom

[Th-Reviling-Language of despising]

- <u>Psa 95:1</u> O come, let us sing unto the LORD: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation.
- <u>Psa 95:2</u> Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms.
- <u>Psa 98:4</u> Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all the earth: make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise.
